New law: Licence plates have to be securely screwed on

To the great annoyance of many motorists, the theft of licence plate thefts has risen over the last couple of years. New legislation has now been introduced, which will make it more difficult for thieves to steal licence plates. From 15th November 2015, all licence plates on cars and vans must be securely fastened with at least two screws.

The screws must be covered with a tight-fitting cap in the same colour as the place on the licence plate where the screw is fastened. The cap should fit so tightly that it can only be removed with the use of tools. There are no specific requirements regarding which type of screw is used, but a cap should be able to be mounted on to the screw.

Free secure attachment of licence plates on operational company cars

In principle, cars expiring before 15th November 2015 do not need to have the licence plate securely fastened. However, as prevention against theft, LeasePlan recommends that your licence plate is securely fastened in accordance with the new rules.

Garages that have a partnership with LeasePlan will kindly attach the licence plate in accordance

with legal requirements, if the car is already at the garage in conjunction with repair, service or similar. However, it is important that the driver specifically ask the garage to attach the licence plate.

Secure attachment of the licence plate is free of charge for LeasePlan's customers, when the car is already at the garage.

Delivery of new company cars

All new cars delivered from LeasePlan are equipped with the statutory attached licence plate.
